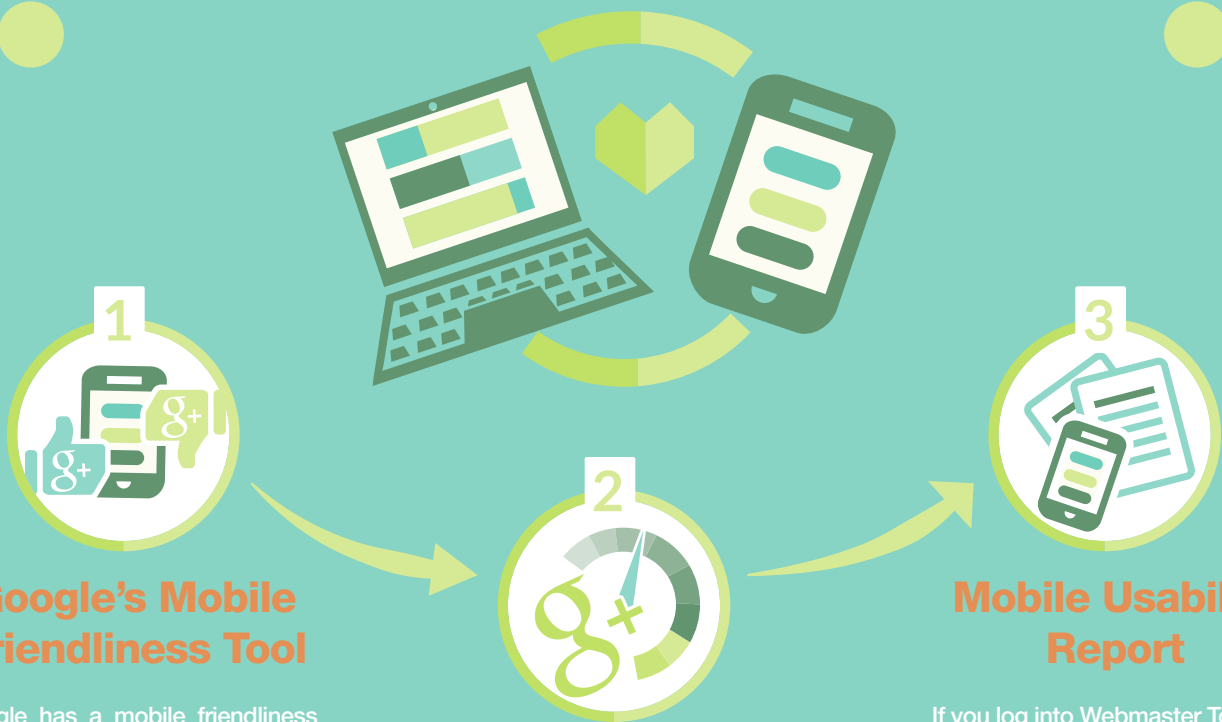

Google's Mobile Friendliness Tool

Google has a mobile friendliness test that you can access via its Webmaster Tools. Just enter the URL of your website and Google will give you a mobile friendly or unfriendly thumbs up or thumbs down.

Google's Page Speed Insights tool

This tool lets you know how fast or slow your site loads when viewed on a mobile device. It also offers some recommendations for your site in case there are issues that need to be fixed.

Mobile Usability Report

If you log into Webmaster Tools, you can access the mobile usability report. This will help you determine problems with regards to the mobile friendliness of each of your web pages. PLUS Google will also send you notifications through Webmaster Tools in the event that your site doesn't meet the mobile friendliness requirements.

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
